

Classroom Activities

Based on “*The Spaniel Family’s Pen Pal Adventure*”

To the Librarians and/or Teachers:

The Spaniel Family’s Pen Pal Adventure is a story about three dogs and their new Pen Pal friend Chico Chihuahua, but there is more to this story. It is also a story about character traits, and specifically the traits of leadership, sharing, teamwork, and dependability. These worksheets are for you to utilize in the library/classroom along with the Spaniel Family Pen Pal book.

There are three sections to the worksheets. Section one contains simple definitions of each character trait along with an example from the book.

Section two is a match test. Students have to match quotes from the book to its corresponding trait.

Section three contains exercises. The exercises will get your 1st-3rd grade students to think beyond the book. The second and third grade will be able to utilize their writing skills to answer the questions.

Section 1 – Character Trait Definitions

Leadership

Definition: Being a good example for everyone else to follow.

Example from the Spaniel Family's Pen Pal story:

Then Daisy said, "Yeah, we need to write to this poor little doggie named Chico. Just look at this ad." Daisy rushed into the doghouse for pen and paper.

Sharing

Definition: Including others in your activities.

Example from the Spaniel Family's Pen Pal story:

The little Chihuahua pulled four bones from his hobo hankie to share.

Teamwork

Definition: Working together for a common goal.

Example from the Spaniel Family's Pen Pal story:

The three doggies took turns writing this letter to Chico.

Dependability

Definition: Being reliable and trustworthy.

Example from the Spaniel Family's Pen Pal story:

When Daisy said, "We have to go see Chico! He needs us and is depending on us to be his friends."

Section 2- Character Traits Match Game for Second and Third Grade.

Each of the four character traits listed on the left side of the page is assigned a letter. A= Leadership, B= Sharing, C= Teamwork, and D= Dependability. Quotes from the book *The Spaniel Family's Pen Pal Adventure*, are on the right side of the page. Read the quotes and choose the trait or traits that best describe the quote (in several of these there is more than one trait being utilized). Circle the corresponding letters. Good Luck!

Section 3- Exercises by Grade Level

First Grade

Ask...If you had a pen pal what would share with them about yourself?

Have the students fill in the blanks on this sentence.

If I had a pen pal I would share _____, _____,
and _____ about myself with them.

Ask... If you were in charge of a picnic who would you ask to help you?

Have students work in groups of three to decide where they will go for their pretend picnic and what food they will bring.

Discuss the results and then **ask...Did your group team up to make the choices of the place and the food?**

Ask... Do you know someone who is a good leader?

The leadership in the pen pal book is shared. Maggie is the leader at the beginning of the story when she finds the pen pal ad. Daisy is the leader when she tells Joe and Maggie, "We have to go see Chico! He needs us and is depending on us to be his friends." Joe is the leader when he says, "Come on let's take a Texas adventure. It will be great!" Chico is the leader when he said, "I made it this far on my Texas adventure! I'm sure I can find a way to Dallas."

Ask... Do you think you could be a good leader? Could you share your leadership with someone?

Ask... Who can you depend on?

Give examples of dependable behavior. Some examples are... returning phone calls, arriving on time, and making and keeping a promise.

Ask... Who can depend on you?

Make copies of the dogs in the wagon coloring sheet found on the website (www.gospaniels.com) under the fun and games section. While the students are coloring ask them where they think the spaniel family should go on their next adventure and who should go with them.

Here is a fun art Activity for first and second grade that emphasis characters and characterization.

Have the students bring an old clean sock. Then take felt in various colors, buttons, thread, yarn, and glue to create sock puppets of the student's favorite characters from the books they are reading. Have a puppet show where the students can act out the things their favorite character would do and say.
